Flood Relief Round 3: Gool (The Chenab Valley), Anantnag (Kashmir Valley): 3-6Nov, 2014



by SPT) pencil etc. to 200 children in Shamsipora, Anantnag dist. of South Kashmir. Round 2: distributed foodkit worth Rs 1500+/ to 50 identified family in Srinagar on Gandhi Jayanti day and 50 in Shamsipora,

Relief 1: During the deluge: Jammu SPT mobilized 65 volunteers, collected three truck load of food, water bottles, clothes and other necessity; and, medicine worth half a million, distributed in affected villages near Jammu and sent out to Srinagar. Jammu team gave local support to Oxfam India initiate its

relief operation in Jammu and the valley.





There can be a completely separate report on Govt relief. rehab, reconstruction and lively hood action. In Shamsipora (Anantnag Dis) for example, only three days prior to my visit a team of Govt conducted officials assessment survey of destroyed and partial





damaged. They, who were assigned 13 villages, took 3 days for this one village of 300 odd houses. At this rate it may take about 40 days. Can people wait till then?



Winter has already set in. In Chenab Valley villages The Old and the New House in Samshi pora, Ananthag in Gul area where we distributed blankets, people

are living not even in tents, but in tarpaulin contraptions! How would they survive cold?! Estimated 40 % of the population of about 12 million of J&K is severely affected, while 70 % is partially affected. Pray, the winter does not make their night mare of deadly ordeal a reality.
